

Wheat Domestic Fundamentals:

The Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana (PMGKAY) which was announced in 2020 for three months till July, is being re-implemented given the worsening situation due to the second wave of Covid-19. Govt. will provide 5-kg additional food grains for free to PDS beneficiaries under the PMGKAY for two months -- May and June. This time, they are not providing pulses under this scheme.

The government has procured 222.33 lakh tonnes of wheat as of 25 April in the new procurement season. The procurement has started in all major producing states.

The procurement agencies have procured more than 93 per cent of the total arrived wheat in the mandis of Punjab, 71.48 LMT of the 76.32 LMT wheat had already been procured. Haryana Government have procured 76.29 lakh tonnes of Wheat through various procurement agencies on the MSP.

The Uttar Pradesh government has procured 5.24 lakh tonne of wheat in the first 22 days of the ongoing rabi marketing year, which began on April 1. This is about four times the procurement done in the year-ago period. Despite the raging Covid pandemic this year, the state has been able to procure record wheat from as many as 99,935 farmers from various districts, against 39,500 farmers in the last season.

In Rajasthan, procurement of wheat at the support price continues with the compliance of rules in the time of Covid epidemic. Till 21 April, 3.91 LMTs have been purchased. A total of 36,931 farmers were benefited, payments are being made directly to their bank accounts through digital means. FCI Delhi purchased 127.94 MT wheat on 21.04.2021. The progressive purchase of wheat as of now is 2183.60 MT.

As per trade sources, India has exported around 3.98 lakh tonnes Wheat in the month of March-2021 at an average FOB of \$269 per tonnes, higher from previous month and the major destinations were Bangladesh, Malaysia, Oman, Qatar and Nepal. Exports are likely to be at higher side as other countries are providing wheat at higher prices. High export will be going to support the domestic market in near term.

Haryana Government on Monday halted the wheat procurement process in 18 mandis of six districts of the state as these were full of procured wheat which was yet to be sent for storage, leading to a space crunch. The process in these mandis will remain suspended for the next 24 hours, as arrangements are being made to set up additional procurement centres. The state government has instructed farmers not to bring their crop to mandis till these centres are functional.

Procurement of wheat has recently commenced in Rabi Marketing Season (RMS) 2021-22 in Punjab, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, Uttarakhand, Chandigarh, Delhi and Gujarat at MSP, Till April 15, a quantity of 64.07 lakh tonnes of wheat has been procured.

International Market Update:

Russian wheat export prices rose for the second week in a row last week due to higher prices in Chicago and Paris, analysts said on Monday. Russian wheat with 12.5% protein loading from Black Sea ports for supply in April was at \$248 a tonne free on board (FOB) at the end of last week, up \$1 from the previous week, IKAR agriculture consultancy said.

Wheat prices fell across all major exporting countries since last month's WASDE with improved winter wheat conditions in several key production regions. Furthermore, some importers are delaying purchases awaiting the upcoming harvest in anticipation of lower new crop prices. The biggest reduction over the past month has been for Russia, where crop prospects have improved, and export quotes have eased amid the current export policies, including the announcement of floating taxes for the new crop year. Its quotes are currently the most competitive. EU quotes have also eased and remain slightly above Russia. Argentine quotes have fallen modestly with slowing farmer sales. Australian quotes have edged somewhat lower with new supplies but remain supported by strong demand from Asian markets. Quotes from Canada are currently the highest among major suppliers.

Argentine farmers are expected to plant over 7.0 million hectares of wheat in 2021/22, up 4% compared to 2020/21, announced the agriculture ministry. The ministry also predicted that farmers could export as much as 14.0 MMT of wheat in 2021/22.

Farmers in Ukraine are nearly a month behind their planting schedule that usually begins at the end of February. Snow and wet conditions kept farmers out of their fields until the end of March. Russian wheat farmers are also delayed but only by about ten days. One analyst put planting 70% behind the same time last year but added that he is optimistic farmers can catch up. SoyEcon raised Russia's wheat production forecast to 70.2 MMT. Ukraine's economy minister said
